**Parenthetical Reference:**

Since there are no page numbers in a broadcast on the Web, then you don’t have to include them. Lead with the title, or part of the title, using the beginning words. Put parenthetical references at the ends of your sentences:

The news report stated that the Nevada Supreme Court considered the ginormous American flag in front of a car dealership was “more a gimmick than a patriotic symbol” (“Court Sides”).
